





# Milton Keynes City Council - collection service and gasification treatment

**Client** Milton Keynes City Council

**Sector** Public sector

**Contract value** £300 million

**Date** 2021 – ongoing

## Background

Milton Keynes City Council required financial and commercial support to identify a contracting partner to collect waste, keep streets clean and maintain council-owned green spaces and play areas. We supported the council in developing tender and contractual documentation, undertook financial evaluations of bidder submissions at all stages of the tender process, provided commercial input into development of the tender specification, and supported the council on the bidder engagement and negotiation process.

Evaluation of bidder submissions took place throughout 2022, and Suez Recycling and Recovery were awarded a contract worth up to £300 million, with services commencing, on schedule, in September 2023. Grant Thornton was then additionally selected by the council to work on their new waste treatment procurement process which is currently underway.

## Our approach

**Evaluation** the council required a service provider covering a wide range of services. Given the variety, careful consideration was required in the weighting of various elements of the bid specification, to ensure bidders were scored highly on those areas most important to the council, while at the same time ensuring the less important elements weren't ignored or subjected to a sub-par offering.

**Accounting and tax** where needed, we brought in our accounting and tax colleagues to support specific requirements from the client – this included reviewing applicants' approach to taxation and general accounting framework compliance as well as how the bidders approached the tax due on the project. Our tax team also advised on strategic tax risks such as the UKETS and CBAM policies.

# North Wales Residual Waste Treatment Partnership

**Client** Flintshire County Council

**Sector** Public sector

**Contract value** £800 million

**Date** 2009 - 2024

## Background

We were engaged as financial advisors by Flintshire County Council, acting as lead authority for a five-council partnership project in North Wales to build the Parc Adfer Energy from Waste facility.

Grant Thornton has supported the full project lifecycle, from the original procurement of the facility through to post-completion refinancing.

Our involvement began over 16 years ago, with the project reaching financial close in December 2016. We provided support from the outline business case stage through to financial close and into the current operational phase. Over the course of our engagement, we developed detailed financial models, negotiated with the selected contractor (enfinium) and their advisers (EY), and presented to committees and boards across the partner councils, as well as at health checks and scrutiny reviews with Welsh Government.

## Our approach

The project presented unique challenges including:

- **Buyout of preferred bidder:** resulting in lengthy due diligence and dialogue around certain commercial positions to allow the project to meet the investment requirements of the new owners without eroding the positions agreed previously or materially altering the risk positions and profile.
- **Change in funding source:** which was proposed post buyout resulted in project finance being introduced. We undertook an assessment of the implications of the change in funding and the impact on the risk positions. We then supported the councils with a two-year negotiation, including with the Welsh Government and their advisers (legal and financial).



# Clyde Valley Residual Waste Treatment Project

**Client** North Lanarkshire Council

**Sector** Public sector

**Contract value** £700 million

**Date** 2012 - 2024

## Background

We were engaged as financial advisers by North Lanarkshire Council, acting as lead authority for a five-council partnership project in the Clyde Valley area. The council were seeking to procure a 25-year waste contract to the collection and transportation of waste, managing the existing transfer stations, as well as developing a material recycling facility to produce a waste derived fuel for thermal incineration. The project reached financial close in May 2016 and commenced operations in January 2020.

## Our approach

**Multiple stakeholders:** This was the first shared service project to achieve financial close in Scotland. A significant milestone considering the multi-authority nature of the project and the challenges that projects with multiple stakeholders invariably present.

**New legislation interpretation:** the project faced suspension due to change in interpretation of legislation by the Scottish Environment Protection Agency (SEPA) requiring assessment and re-running of financial models to gauge impact on whole life project costs to keep the project on track.

**Internal committee evidence:** We performed detailed analysis of cost and income assumptions and benchmarking to address specific internal committee and council member queries.
