Foreword

We are delighted to present the Northamptonshire LTD 2025 report, showcasing the scale, resilience and adaptability of the county's leading privately owned businesses. This year's analysis highlights a business community that continues to perform strongly, even as economic uncertainty, cost pressures and policy change reshape the operating environment.

Collectively, the Top 100 privately owned businesses generated £10.1 billion in turnover, representing year-on-year growth of 3.6%. More notably, EBITDA increased by 16.0% to £600 million due to organic and inorganic growth, with margins strengthening from 5.3% to 5.9%, underlining improved operational discipline and pricing resilience across the group. These results demonstrate a clear ability among Northamptonshire businesses to protect profitability while continuing to invest for the future.

Employment growth has been a further standout theme. Headcount across the Top 100 rose by 10.4% to over 39,500 employees, reflecting sustained confidence and demand for skills. Despite ongoing wage inflation and higher employment-related costs, businesses have remained committed to their people, with total remuneration up by 10.0%, supporting both attraction and retention in a competitive labour market. This continued investment in talent is a key differentiator for the county.

From a balance-sheet perspective, Northamptonshire companies remain well positioned. Shareholder funds increased by 5.0%, while long-term debt reduced by 17.5%, resulting in improved gearing levels across the cohort. This strengthening of capital structures provides businesses with greater flexibility to pursue organic growth, fund capital investment and respond to acquisition opportunities as market conditions evolve.

Sector performance across the Top 100 reflects the county's broad economic base. Business Support Services remains the largest contributing sector, delivering an impressive 14.4% increase in turnover compared with the prior year.

Real Estate & Construction also plays a significant role, benefiting from infrastructure investment, regeneration activity and sustained demand for commercial and residential development. The sector's scale and momentum align closely with Northamptonshire's strategic location at the heart of the UK's transport network, enabling efficient access to national markets and supply chains.

This connectivity advantage has been further enhanced by major infrastructure developments, including the opening of the North West Relief Road in December 2025, which improves links between the A428, A5199 and the M1, easing congestion and supporting freight access to key business parks. Alongside this, West Northamptonshire Council's £100+ million capital investment programme across transport, housing, education and regeneration continues to create a strong platform for long-term economic growth.

Beyond the headline figures, this year's report also highlights a growing focus on sustainability, efficiency and future-proofing. Businesses across traditional and emerging sectors are increasingly exploring lower-carbon solutions, operational efficiencies and long-term succession planning, recognising that resilience and value creation are intrinsically linked.

This report is the result of a continued collaboration between Grant Thornton, Howes Percival and AllThingsBusiness - Combining financial insight and legal expertise to deliver a comprehensive perspective on Northamptonshire's private business landscape. Our shared ambition is to celebrate success, highlight opportunity and support business owners.

Looking ahead, challenges remain - from economic volatility and skills shortages to evolving tax and regulatory requirements. However, the performance and adaptability demonstrated by the businesses featured in this report provide strong confidence that Northamptonshire is well positioned to continue growing and innovating.

About

Now in its 13th year, Northamptonshire LTD. is part of an annual series of business analysis by UK county which seeks to highlight and celebrate some of the county's most successful, privately owned businesses, and provide them with the recognition they deserve for their contribution to the region and wider UK economy.

We begin this report by reviewing the county's 100 largest businesses based on turnover. The report also showcases the 50 most profitable, 50 fastest growing and 25 largest international contributors, providing insight into the scale and diversity of Northamptonshire's market.

Our methodology explained

Northamptonshire LTD. 2025 is compiled using the most recent publicly available accounts (as of 1st October 2025).

Our Top 100 league table excludes companies that are listed, owned by listed businesses, schools, trusts, charities, and businesses that are subsidiaries of overseas companies. We have also compared our data with previous Northamptonshire Ltd. results to provide an insight into economic trends across sectors.

Inevitably, there is an unavoidable time delay between the availability of data utilised and the ultimate presentation of this report, alongside differing year-ends to consider.



A closer look


Analysis of the results of Northamptonshire LTD. Business activity is heavily concentrated around Northampton, with significant clusters extending north toward Kettering and Corby, and smaller groups west near Daventry and south toward Towcester. The distribution indicates a strong central hub with secondary concentrations in the northern part of the county.

Case studies

Barton Petroleum: Built on Family Values



Barton Petroleum is a third-generation, family-owned fuel distribution business founded in 1972. Today, it is led by Managing Director Clive Morin alongside brothers Lawrence Burton (Director) and Oliver Burton (Commercial Director). While the scale of the business has grown significantly, its core values remain unchanged: reliability, responsibility and long-term thinking.

Being a family business has always had a profound influence on Barton Petroleum's culture. That mindset underpins everything from investment decisions to customer relationships.

The energy sector has changed dramatically since the company's early days, and Barton Petroleum has adapted continuously. From expanding its depot network from Northamptonshire into neighbouring counties and beyond, to investing in modern fleet, systems and infrastructure, the business has evolved while maintaining a strong service ethos. Recent growth has included the acquisition of an additional site adjacent to its Wellingborough head office, creating space for further operational development and an additional workshop for Kettering based subsidiary FW Abbott Limited, the multidisciplinary automotive specialist.

As a long-established fossil fuel distributor, Barton Petroleum is acutely aware of the pressures facing the energy industry. While decarbonisation through electrification is gathering pace in certain settings, the business recognises that for many rural households and sectors such as construction, agriculture and transport, liquid fuels remain essential. Rather than resisting change, Barton Petroleum has focused on how those fuels can evolve.

The company has been an early adopter of HVO (Hydrotreated Vegetable Oil) and has been accredited under the Renewable Fuels Assurance Scheme since 2023. Commercial demand for HVO has increased steadily, offering customers a practical way to reduce carbon emissions without replacing existing equipment. Barton Petroleum also actively supports industry efforts to extend low-carbon fuel options to domestic heating, particularly for off-grid rural homes.

Being family-run shapes how Barton Petroleum treats its people and customers. Fuel delivery is seen as a responsibility as much as a service — particularly during winter months when many customers rely on heating oil. Significant investment is made in trained staff, fleet resilience and contingency planning to ensure reliability when it matters most.

“We like to look after our people, we tend to think quite long term, and we don't take lots of risk. I think that's probably true of a lot of family businesses, and I don't think it's a bad way to run a company.”

From Local Northamptonshire Start up to Global Leader - Sign In App

Sign In App began with a simple but powerful idea: make visitor management safer, smarter, and frictionless for organisations everywhere. Co-founders Chris Burton and Dan Harding set out to build a platform that delivered value at scale, easy to adopt, intuitive to use, and consistently reliable across diverse environments.

Rooted in Northamptonshire, the business invested in local talent and created a culture where customer experience was the standard, not a department. This regional foundation gave Sign In App the agility and expertise to grow quickly while staying connected to its community.

Over time, the platform evolved beyond visitor management, supporting compliance and safety for organisations worldwide. Recognising the scale of opportunity early on, Chris and Dan pursued strategic investment to accelerate growth and establish leadership in North America, a move that has been instrumental in positioning the business as a global market leader.

Looking ahead, Sign In App is investing heavily in its tech roadmap, with advanced compliance tools and new integrations set to launch over the next 12 months, helping organisations run even safer, more connected sites globally.
